


SUMMARY DESCRIPTION

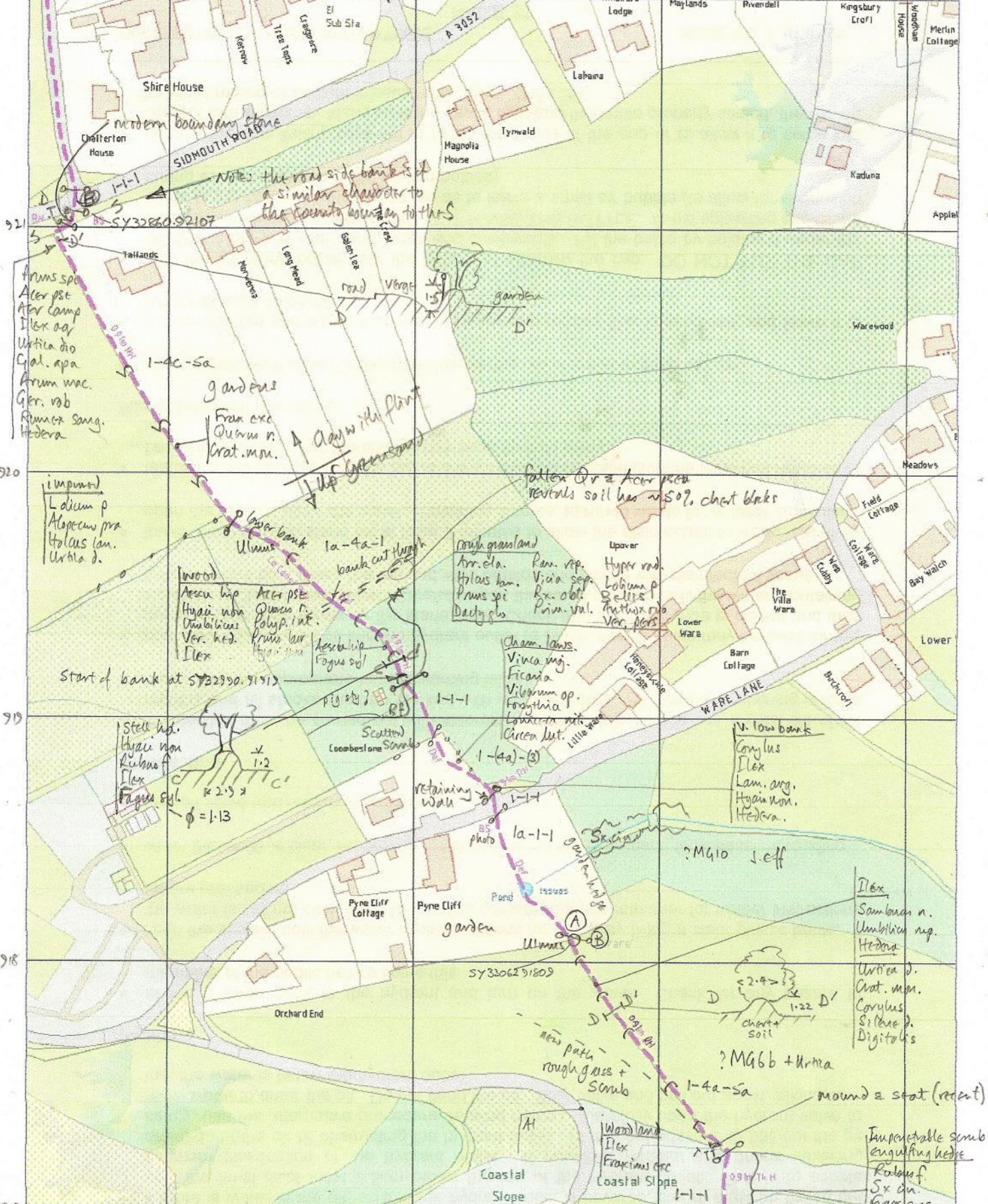
The boundary runs from the southern boundary of Pyne Cliff to a boundary stone marked on Ware Lane (photo). With in the garden there is a slight lynchett with an ornamental pond and two shrub beds along the line of the boundary which the OS describes as defaced. North of the lane the boundary starts on the property boundary but then veers to the W into the garden and across an un managed field, now being encroached by bramble and scrub.

On entering the wooded slope, the boundary is clearly marked by a substantial bank which starts abruptly at SY32990.91919. It clearly extended further to the S in the past and had a hedge associated with it because the OS note reads: 0.91m RH. The top of the bank now has substantial beech (dbh 1.13m) and horse chestnut trees. The cut end of the bank reveals the random chert and soil construction of the bank.

Progressing up the slope the bank lessens in height but is still visible on reaching the backs of the gardens of the properties along Sidmouth Rd. The boundary continues along as a bank and ditch structure dividing the field of improved grassland and the domestic gardens. Although the ditch is on the Devon side, the boundary is marked as 0.91m RH on the Dorset side. A boundary stone is marked on the road at the end of this section of boundary.

The fairly level ground of the field and properties along Sidmouth Rd are on Clay with Flints. To the south are Upper Greensand strata either side of the Ware Lane valley.

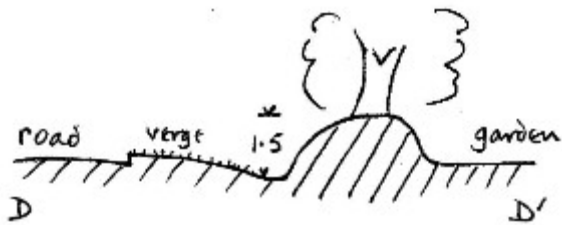
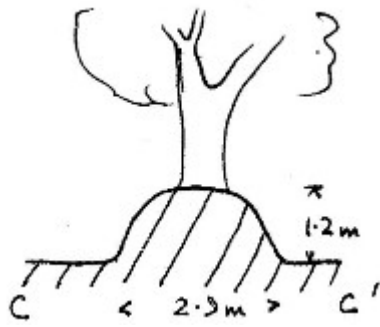

From this point the boundary runs through domestic gardens and much modified estate land. The truncated nature of the bank in the wood north of Ware Lane suggests the bank would have continued southwards, possibly linking to the bank S of Pyne Cliff. It would have been removed when designing the gardens, to construct Ware Lane and to plough the field.
